5.I. Discussion Of Fireworks Regulations

**Background**

In the last session of the Georgia Legislature, changes were made to previously adopted Fireworks laws allowing local governments the opportunity to regulate the time and place for using fireworks in local communities/celebrations. Since various Council Members have inquired about this matter, a memo outlining information/options under the recently passed law has been prepared by the City Attorney's Office.

Given our location near the International Airport and the upcoming holiday- July 4th; Staff wanted to know what direction (if any) the City Council wanted to move forward with regarding the placement of greater restrictions on the use of Fireworks here in Hapeville? Staff is prepared to brief you and provide various options if Council wishes to enact stricter rules as provided under the new law.

**Background:**

As part of the new IT contractor agreement with Liberty Technology, a key deliverable

was the creation of a five (5) year Technology Plan. The City Manager has worked on this plan directly with the contractor as well as key Department Staff. Portions of the proposed plan (Year #1) have already been included in the City Manager's Budget proposal. A five year technology plan was agreed upon to provide a technically sound basis for making badly needed technology upgrades and financial investments in new technology. The concept was two (2) fold; 1) make sound recommendations that was integrated on **What technology to buy** and 2) bring forward a sound financial approach on **how to pay for** the various technology investments that needed to be done by the City.

Attached for your review and consideration is our recommended 5 Year Technology Investment Plan. The City Manager has arranged for a special briefing for the Council on this important matter. Your approval of this plan (or modified plan) is critical to the success of the City's daily operations.
