Nothing within this chapter shall prohibit a licensed growler store from selling beer and wine by the glass, on premises, in a manner which is expressly permitted by the state of Georgia under the Georgia Alcoholic Beverage Code. This exemption shall remain in effect until December 31, 2016 or until the effective date of the City’s pending comprehensive update of Chapter 5 of the City’s Alcohol Beverages Code, whichever occurs sooner.</p>	<p>(j) Temporary Exemption.
