1. Call to Order: Mayor Hallman called the Council Session to order at 6:02pm at 700 Doug Davis Drive, Hapeville, GA 30354.

4. PUBLIC HEARING
  - 4.I Consideration and Action on Abandonment of Road – Virginia Avenue at Elkins Street and Rainey Avenue  
A public hearing was opened to hear staff and public comments. There were no public comments. The public hearing was closed. Alderman Rast made a motion to approve, Councilman Adams seconded. Discussion: Alderman Rast asked did this mean that the plat would be deeded to Patel. Motion carried 4-0.

7.I Consideration and Action on Solid Waste Ordinance – 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading

Ordinance stood as first reading.

**8.II Consideration on FY2018-2019 Budget Amendment Ordinance – 1<sup>st</sup> Reading**  
Ordinance stood as first reading.

**8.III Consideration on Amending and Updating Mobile Food Truck Ordinance to Add Fixed Fire Suppression System – 1<sup>st</sup> Reading**

Council discussed the high cost of the suppression system and discussed other safety alternatives such as requiring a class K fire extinguisher. Councilman Horsley made a motion to allow for public comment, Councilman Adams seconded. Motion carried 4-0. Ms. Keisia Carroll made a comment. The consensus of Mayor and Council is to not add the hood suppression requirement.

**8.IV Discussion on Amending and Updating the Sign Ordinance**

Mr. Smith stated the ordinance draft is still subject to change based on legal review.

**MOTION: Councilman Horsley made a motion to amend the agenda to add an item, Councilman Adams seconded. Motion carried 4-0. Councilman Horsley made a motion to extend the sign moratorium until February 18, 2020, Councilman Alexander seconded. Motion carried 4-0.**

**8.V Discussion on Tree Conservation Text Amendment**

Arborist, Teresa Eldridge was there to answer Mayor and Council's questions.

9. City Manager Report –

Mr. Young said the water metering project is progressing. He said staff is working to get the live streaming equipment installed and the goal is to live stream the December 10 Council meeting or January. Taxes had been collected. By January, staff will bring a plan to Council for monitoring the parks over the weekend. Initial financials for yearend given to Council and will be posted on the city's website. Next Tuesday at 8PM will be the tree lighting in the park. Lastly, the pedestrian bridge will be closed for a couple of months.
