During the month of March, the Department conducted 49 pre-fire plans and 87 blood pressure checks, which were done at the Senior Center. Also, the following trainings were held: Narcan Administration, Pump Panel Overview, EMS (Airway), Territory Familiarization, Patient Packaging and Stabilization, Ladder Operations and Familiarization, Command Vehicle Winch Operations, web based Target Solutions classes. Also, 2 shift of the personnel attended the Georgia EMS Leadership Conference, and 2 other obtained their certification as Basic Life Support (BLS) Instructors. Three members of the Department taught a recertification BLS provider class. We have conducted 4 Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) classes which are being attended by 8 members of the community. The group of 5th graders "Boys to Men" from Hapeville Elementary visited station for a tour and to learn about becoming a Firefighter. FF/EMT Caleb Labiche obtained his Advanced EMT certification.

Between March 1, 2017 and March 30, 2017 the Hapeville Police Department responded to 479 calls for service. There were (5) Assaults; including domestic altercations (5) Burglaries, (2) Robberies, (31) Larcenies; including (11) Entering Autos, (9) Stolen Vehicles and (11) Thefts. The Department recovered (13) stolen vehicles and (1) stolen property item. The Department made (23) arrests. The average response time was 1min 40secs. The Department issued (468) citations to include parking, traffic and general copies. The E911 Center handled 3,045 incoming calls.

Department Personnel continued to receive daily roll call and in-service training on topics such as in Fostering Positive Community Relations, Domestic Violence, Legal Updates, and the HPD's Standard Operating Procedures.

The Detective Division reviewed (31) cases, assigned (17) cases for investigation, and closed (15) cases. (2) Cases were closed with arrest warrants. The Detective Division obtained (4) warrants and responded to (4) crime scenes for investigation.

Code Enforcement: Code Enforcement handled (253) new calls for service. During these calls, the unit documented (31) animal incidents, (22) parking in grass, (66) Tall Grass & Weeds, (25) permit issues, (39) outside storage, (77) littering or pollution problems, (28) property maintenance- exterior, and (0) other code compliance issues. The unit closed (200) cases, and issued (94) citations.

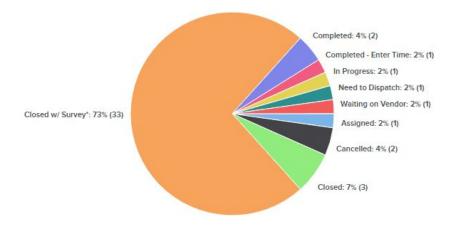

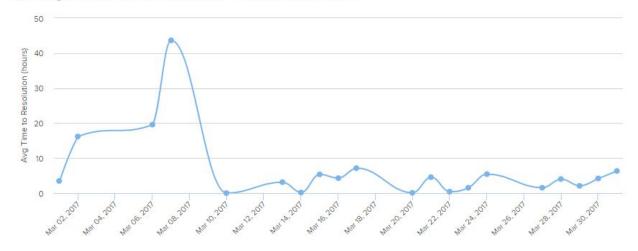
