During the months of August and part of September, the Department conducted 3 pre-fire plans, 15 inspections, 5 new construction consultations, 5 plan reviews, issued 1 CO certificate and 41 blood pressure checks, which were done at the Senior Center. Also, the following trainings were held: Rescue Jack setup and operations, Pre-incident planning, Air-pack training and review, Engine 1 and Ladder 2 driver, pump familiarization and aerial platform training, Target Solutions online training, Pediatric assessment class and Pediatric Advanced Life Support recertification, Pediatric Basic and Advanced Emergencies, Hazmat Awareness and Operations, Trauma and Medical Assessment, Engine 1 and Ladder 2 Driver Operations Training. Also, members of the Department performed inspections on all Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and equipment maintenance for all emergency vehicles. The Department announced the promotion of our 3 new Battalion Chiefs: BC Brock Robertson, BC Mike Donaldson and BC Bobby Craig and our new Division Training Chief Joey Overton. The Training Division Chief has completed all the Lieutenants and Sergeants promotional documentation in preparation for the upcoming testing. He has also completed the painting of the defensive driving course, and continues working on building the Imagetrend web based training tab for the Department to move forward with paperless training forms. As part of our Public Safety Education our Department taught fire extinguisher classes at the Senior Center and Auto-Chlor plant. Two of the Paramedics completed the Advanced Cardiac Life Support instructor course and one completed the Pediatric Advanced Life Support Instructor certification as well. Members of one of our shifts conducted a fire extinguisher class for approximately 30 employees of the Auto Chlor plant. A Fire Drill was also conducted by the employees at the Delta Reservations Center with the assistance of the Department. The Chief and Training Division Chief attended the Homeland Security/Georgia Emergency Management Agency (GEMSA) regarding the required steps to recover money from losses resulting from Hurricane Irma. The Department responded to a total of 26 Hurricane Irma related calls, of which 18 were fallen trees with down power lines. As part of the recovery process, the Department collaborated with Atlanta Fulton County Emergency Management Agency(AFCEMA) by providing the required documentation for possible

reimbursement. The Department conducted a boot drive to collect funds in support of all the Fire Departments and the Firefighters from Houston who were affected by Hurricane Harvey. We collected a total of \$2,195. Over a period of 4 days, the Department collected donations of basic needs items to be donated to the relief effort for those affected in Puerto Rico due to Hurricane María. A total of 89 cases of water and more than a 100 boxes with canned goods, hygiene products and first aid over the counter medications were delivered to a local organization in charge of transporting the donations.

Department Personnel continued to receive daily roll call and in-service training on topics such as Communications Training, Legal Updates, and the HPD's Standard Operating Procedures.

The Detective Division reviewed (47) cases, assigned (26) cases for investigation, and closed (21) cases. The Detective Division obtained (11) warrants and responded to (23) crime scenes for investigation and executed (1) search warrant.

Code Enforcement: Code Enforcement handled (103) new calls for service. During these calls, the unit documented (17) animal incidents, (6) parking in grass, (8) Tall Grass & Weeds, (4) permit issues, (1) outside storage, (13) littering or pollution problems, (1) property maintenance-exterior, and (15) other code compliance issues. The unit closed (55) cases, and issued (12) citations.

Between September 1, 2017 and September 30, 2017 there were (569) calls for service. There was (1) Assaults, (5) Burglaries, (4) Robberies, (76) Larcenies; including 48 Entering Autos, 9 Stolen Vehicles and 19 Thefts. The Department recovered (6) stolen vehicles and made 29 arrests. Average Response Time was 1min 56 secs.

The Department issued 325 citations to include parking, traffic and general copies.

The E911 Center processed 3,669 calls.

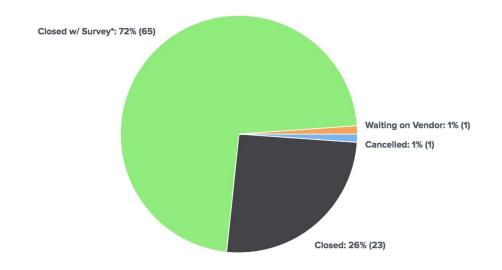

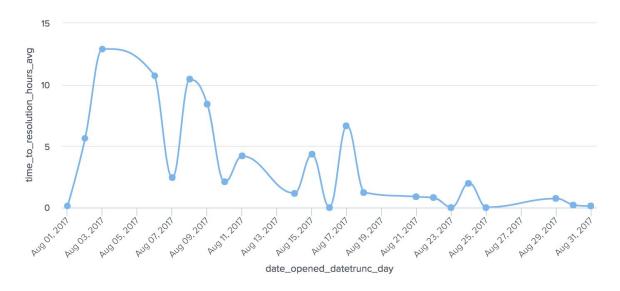
