During the month of November, the Department conducted 5 new construction site visits, 1 smoke detector installation, 7 plan reviews, 4 new alcohol license inspections, 6 annual inspections, 3 temporary certificate of occupancy inspections, 4 alcohol renewal inspections, 4 certificates of occupancy, 3 unsafe conditions investigations, and 78 blood pressure checks at the Senior Center. Also, the following trainings were held: Fire Review and Tactics, Extrication class, Report Writing, EMS Pediatrics, Medical Trauma, Engine 1 and Ladder 2 Driver Operations Training, and Emergency Vehicles Operator Course. Our training division Chief has worked on the following: reviewed and updated the fire training Standard of Procedure (SOP), developed a detailed hydrant maintenance plan and documentation, and respiratory protection program. He is also working on the development of the training plan for the upcoming 2018 year. We have completed every part of our promotional processes, with our 3 newly promoted sergeants. Three members of our Department met with Delta Reservations management staff and safety leadership to jointly collaborate in the development of Safety Program for their organization. Our Firefighter was recognized during the November Exchange Club meeting.

Between November 1, 2017 and November 30, 2017 there were (519) calls for service. There were (2) Assaults, (9) Burglaries, (3) Robberies, (99) Larcenies; including 81 Entering Autos, 8

Stolen Vehicles and 10 Thefts. The Department recovered (12) stolen vehicles and (3) Stolen Property items. The Department made 38 arrests. Average Response time was 2min 01sec.

The department issued 373 citations to include parking, traffic and general copies.

The E911 Center processed 3,176 calls.

Department Personnel continued to receive daily roll call and in-service training on topics such as Cultural Awareness, Fostering Better Community Relations, Conducting Effective Performance Appraisals, Police Legitimacy and Procedural Justice for Community Relations, Searching Motor Vehicles, Eyewitness Identification, Evidence Collection & Preservation Use of Deadly Force, Juvenile Justice Reform, Vehicle Pullovers, Legal Updates, Fulton County Child Abuse Protocols, and the HPD's Standard Operating Procedures.

The Detective Division reviewed (81) cases, assigned (31) cases for investigation, and closed (23) cases. (1) Cases were closed with arrest warrants. The Detective Division obtained (2) warrants and responded to (7) crime scenes for investigation.

Code Enforcement: Code Enforcement handled (84) new calls for service. During these calls, the unit documented (4) animal incidents, (11) parking in grass, (8) tall grass & weeds, (11) permit issues, (15) outside storage, (27) littering or pollution problems, (3) property maintenance- exterior, and (5) other code compliance issues. The unit closed (73) cases, and issued (9) citations.

Abatements: The current properties that are under abatements are as follow: 3 Woodrow lot (between Wheeler and N. Fulton Avenue), 330 Mount Zion Road, 472 Walnut Street, 370 Woodrow Avenue, 3001 Dogwood Drive, 3309 North Fulton Avenue, and 3227 Jackson Street.
