During the month of July, the Department conducted the following: 2 fire investigations (1 structural and 1 contents), 1 technical rescue, 5 new construction site visits, 11 pre-fire plans, 5 issued business licenses/certificates of occupancy, 2 plan reviews, 1 consultation, and 83 blood pressure checks at the Senior Center. Also, the following in house trainings were completed by our personnel: Territory Familiarization, Driver Training, Fire Services Incident Planning Process – The Planning P, Image Trend Elite Q&A, Fire Control, Fire Investigations for the First Responders, Incident Command for High-Rise Operations, and Incident Command for Structural Collapse Incidents. The Training Division Chief is currently working on the development of the 2019 training curriculum. The training is being developed based on the community needs as the city moves forward with the scheduled development process. Members also attended and/or participated in the following off-site event and meetings: National Incident Management System (NIMS) 300 & 400, Train the Trainer for Traffic Incident Management Course and Fulton County Public Safety Active Shooter Response Plan meeting.

Between July 1, 2018 and July 31, 2018 there were (523) calls for service. There was (1) Assault, (6) Burglaries, (2) Robberies, (62) Larcenies; including 37 Entering Autos, 2 Stolen Vehicles and 23 Thefts. The Department recovered (6) Stolen Vehicles and (4) Stolen Property Items. The Department made 33 arrests. Average Response time was 1 min 49 secs.

The Department issued 338 citations to include parking, traffic and general copies.

The E911 Center processed 3,268 calls.

Department Personnel continued to receive daily roll call and in-service training on topics such as Juvenile Offenders, Eyewitness ID, Ethics and Employee Assistance Program, and the HPD's Standard Operating Procedures.

The Detective Division reviewed (57) cases, assigned (15) cases for investigation, and closed (5) cases. (1) Case was closed with arrest warrants and (3) by CID arrests. The Detective Division obtained (36) warrants, responded to (10) crime scenes for investigation and executed (4) search warrant.

Code Enforcement: Code Enforcement handled (43) new calls for service. During these calls, the unit documented (2) animal incidents, (3) parking issues, (11) tall grass & weeds, (5) permit issues, (10) outside storage, (23) littering or pollution problems, and (2) property maintenance-exterior. The unit closed (25) cases and issued (7) citations.
