During the month of August, the Department conducted the following: 49 new construction site visits, 1 business license, 11 alcohol renewal inspections, 1 complaint investigation, 1 new alcohol license, 1 fire alarm review, 20 annual inspections, 1 fire drill, 1 unsafe conditions investigation, 2 planning & zoning impact studies, 1 building plan review, 1 fire alarm inspection, 5 pre – fire plans, and 85 blood pressure checks at the Senior Center. Also, the following in house trainings were completed by our personnel: Image Trend Elite Self - Instruction, Driver Training and Department of Homeland Security – FEMA Professional Development Series (all department officers). Nine of our firefighters completed the firefighter 2 course, 3 of those individuals have tested and obtained the National Professional Qualifications Board Firefighter 2 certification. The Department participated in this year's National Night Out hosted by the Police Department. During the event, we provided fire prevention education to attendees while having them come through the Fire Safety House loaned to us by the College Park Fire Department. The Fire Chief and Training Division Chief attended the Active Shooter Seminar at the Georgia Public Safety Training Center (GPSTC) and are working on the development of an Active Shooter response plan for the South Fulton County cities. They also conducted mutual aid training for the Chattahoochee Fire Department by teaching Traffic Incident Management to all three fire shifts and their Public Works Department. The Training Division Chief is currently in the process of developing a lesson plan for an in-service class on parking deck fires.

Between August 1, 2018 and August 31, 2018 there were (535) calls for service. There were (7) Assaults, (3) Burglaries, (3) Robberies, (50) Larcenies; including 19 Entering Autos, 9 Stolen Vehicles and 22 Thefts. The Department recovered (9) stolen vehicles. The Department made 34 arrests. Average Response time was 1 min. 44 secs.

The Department issued 493 citations to include parking, traffic and general copies.

The E911 Center processed 3,461 calls.

Department Personnel continued to receive daily roll call and in-service training on topics such as Use of Deadly Force, Autism & De-escalation, Death Notification, Legislative Updates 2018, Dealing with the Mentally III & People with a Diminished Capacity, and the HPD's Standard Operating Procedures.

The Detective Division reviewed (50) cases, assigned (15) cases for investigation, and closed (4) cases. (0) Cases were closed with arrest warrants and (0) by CID arrest. The Detective Division obtained (0) warrants, responded to (7) crime scenes for investigation and executed (0) search warrant(s).

Code Enforcement: Code Enforcement handled (36) new calls for service. During these calls, the unit documented (0) animal incidents, (0) parking in grass, (12) tall grass & weeds, (3) permit issues, (3) outside storage, (6) littering or pollution problems, and (1) property maintenance- exterior. The unit closed (65) cases and issued (1) citations.
