Between January 1, 2019 and January 31, 2019 there were (546) calls for service. There were (2) Assaults, (3) Burglaries, (1) Robbery, (50) Larcenies; including 35 Entering Autos, 4 Stolen Vehicles and 11 Thefts. The Department recovered (4) stolen vehicles and (3) stolen property items. The Department made 37 arrests. Average Response time was 1 min 50 secs. The Department issued 466 citations to include parking, traffic and general copies. The E911 Center processed 3,140 calls.

Department Personnel continued to receive daily roll call and in-service training on the department's Standard Operating Procedures.

The Detective Division reviewed (100) cases, assigned (34) cases for investigation, and closed (20) cases. (3) Cases were closed with arrest warrants and (1) by CID arrest. The Detective Division obtained (15) arrest warrants, responded to (16) crime scenes for investigation, conducted two special operations and executed (3) search warrant(s).

Code Enforcement: Code Enforcement handled (97) new calls for service. During these calls, the unit documented (9) animal incidents, (1) parking in grass, (1) tall grass & weeds, (10) permit issues, (58) outside storage, (15) littering or pollution problems, (2) Commercial Container Violation(s) and (2) property maintenance- exterior. The unit closed (106) cases and issued (7) citations.

## Department Activities:

Staff attended the Virginia Avenue Smart Corridor meeting with Aerotropolis CID and Modern Mobility Partners on January 10th. The purpose of the meeting was to begin discussion regarding the implementation of various "smart" projects for the Virginia Avenue corridor which includes the City of East Point, College Park, and Hapeville. Modern Mobility Partner's have obtained much of the data needed and provided the participating cities with a a list of additional data needs to help move the project forward, such as WiFi capability and Traffic Control.

Staff attended the Finding the Flint Workgroup meeting on January 15th. The Finding the Flint initiative kicked off by Hannah Palmer briefed many of its successes in the previous year and its ongoing goals for the 2019 year. Ms. Palmer announced that the City of Hapeville adopted a resolution supporting the Finding the Flint principles. Additional updates mentioned during the workshop included the State Farmer's Market Study (Forest Park) as they are undergoing much-needed renovations, opening more funding opportunities and urban community involvement, and Dr. Yomi's Eco Action class known as the Atlanta Watershed Learning Network (AWLN). We also had guest speaker Ben Emanuel from Washington, DC who's project was similar to the initiative set forth by Finding the Flint. Emanuel's presentation displayed many ideas that could be adopted to the Finding the Flint plans as well.
