During the month of February, the Department conducted the following: 6 new construction site visits, 1 business licenses/certificates on occupancy, 1 fire alarm complaint investigation, 18 annual inspection, 1 ADA consultation, 5 plan reviews and 84 blood pressure checks at the Senior Center. Also, the following in house trainings were completed by our personnel: Physical Agility, Workplace Diversity, Sexual Harassment Awareness, General HIPAA Awareness, Fire Alarm Reviews, Ladder Familiarization, Pharmacology and Spinal Immobilization and Aerial Operations, for a combined total of 1424 hours of training. The Fire Chief and Training Division Chief visited the Georgia Power Social Media Center and Storm Center. A member of the Department attended the Leadership in Supervision: Creating Environments for Professional Growth held at the Georgia Public Safety Training Center (GPSTC) in Forsyth, Ga. The Training Division Chief is currently in the process of preparing new outdoor burning regulations and permit. The newest hire Charles Rose graduated from the NPQ Firefighter 1 and Hazardous Materials Operations certifications. This training was also held at GPSTC, and was a total of 8 weeks long.

Between February 1, 2019 and February 28, 2019 there were (547) calls for service. There was (1) Assault, (8) Burglaries, (4) Robberies, (28) Larcenies; including 16 Entering Autos, 3 Stolen Vehicles and 9 Thefts. The Department recovered (7) stolen vehicles and (2) stolen property items. The Department made 38 arrests. Average Response time was 1 min 49 secs.

The Department issued 357 citations to include parking, traffic and general copies.

The E911 Center processed 2,524 calls.

Department Personnel continued to receive daily roll call and in-service training on the department's Standard Operating Procedures.

The Detective Division reviewed (100) cases, assigned (34) cases for investigation, and closed (9) cases. (1) Case was closed with arrest warrant and (0) by CID arrest. The Detective Division obtained (3) arrest warrants, responded to (8) crime scenes for investigation, conducted (1) special operations and executed (0) search warrant(s). The bait car was used (0).

Code Enforcement: Code Enforcement handled (91) new calls for service. During these calls, the unit documented (7) animal incidents, (1) parking in grass, (1) tall grass & weeds, (10) permit issues, (50) outside storage, (18) littering or pollution problems, (1) Commercial Container violation(s) and (2) property maintenance- exterior. The unit closed (36) cases and issued (18) citations.
