During the month of August, the Department conducted the following: 14 new construction site visits, 5 certificate of completion inspection / business licenses, 7 plan reviews, 4 annual inspections, 1 fire alarm inspection, 1 sprinkler system inspection, 6 pre-fire plans, 1 obstruction of fire lane complaint investigation, and 73 blood pressure checks at the Senior Center. The Fire Marshal and Assistant Fire Marshal also attended 2 Academy Theater construction meetings. Also, the following in house and off-site trainings were completed by our personnel: OB Emergencies, Infectious Diseases, Toxicology / Opioids, Endocrine / Diabetes, Pediatric Medical Emergencies, New Hire Territory Familiarization Training, Cardiology & Trauma, In -Service Stryker Stretcher Training, Bi – annual EMS Refresher. The Fire Chief, Training Division Chief and Fire Marshal attended the Metro Atlanta Fire Chiefs Association meeting in the City of Fairburn. The Training Division Chief along with a member of the Police Department provided "Stop the Bleed" training for 67 city employees. He is also currently working on the development of the hydraulics class, which will be taught to all shifts later on this fall. Four members of the administration attended the Occupational Cancer Awareness Training Seminar held at the Georgia Public Safety Training Center in Forsyth, GA. The Department has begun conducting boot drives for childhood cancer. All proceeds will be donated to the Amanda Riley foundation. The mission of the foundation is to provide support for children who are currently battling cancer. T-shirts will be sold this week as part of the fundraiser.

Staff completed review of the AeroATL Greenway Concept Development proposals for the Model Mile project. <u>Background:</u> The Airport West Community Improvement District and Airport South Community Improvement District (collectively "Aerotropolis Atlanta Community Improvement Districts" or "AACIDs") were recently awarded a Livable Communities Initiative (LCI) grant to complete the AeroATL Greenway Concept Development. The AeroATL Greenway Concept Development is the next phase of the AeroATL Greenway Plan completed in fall 2018. Each of the partners (Aerotropolis Atlanta Alliance, Aerotropolis Atlanta CIDs, Atlanta, Clayton County, East Point, Forest Park, Hapeville, South Fulton and Union City) have identified a model mile trail segment to further develop concept and feasibility.

Staff attended the Community Development Assistance Program (CDAP) kick-off meeting for the Aerotropolis Atlanta Land Use Study through the Atlanta Regional Commission's technical assistance program. The meeting was held on Wednesday, August 28th from 3pm-4pm at Aerotropolis Atlanta HQ. Each municipality was given an overview of the project goals, deliverables, and schedule and discussed with ARC on their existing conditions research to date and their request to seek input from all of the municipalities on potential points of collaboration.
