During the month of September, The Department conducted the following: 7 new construction site visits, 3 certificate of completion inspection / business licenses, 1 plan reviews, 20 annual inspections/alcohol license renewals, 4 mobile food vendor inspections, and 82 blood pressure checks at the Senior Center. The Fire Marshal and Assistant Fire Marshal also attended the Happy Days logistic meeting, post construction meeting for the new Academy Theatre building, a development meeting for the Chick-fil-A new construction and a metro chiefs meeting at the Sandy Springs Fire Department. In addition, the Assistant Fire Marshal conducted 9 fire prevention classes throughout the day during the Happy Days Festival with a total of 70 children and 9 adults attending. Also, the following in house and off-site trainings were completed by our personnel: Active Shooter, Truck 2 (Ladder Truck) Operations, New Hire Territory Familiarization Training, Cardiology & Trauma and an In – Service Stryker Stretcher Training. The Fire Chief and Training Division Chief attended the Metro Atlanta Fire Chiefs Association meeting in the City of College Park. A member of our administration team attended the Stop the Stigma at the Georgia Public Safety Training Center in Forsyth, GA. The Department conducted a total of 9 boot drives throughout the month to benefit the Amanda Riley foundation. So far, we have collected approximately \$7,000 but will continue our t-shirt sale until the end of October in order to increase our fundraiser revenue. The mission of the foundation is to provide support for children who are currently battling cancer.

Between September 1, 2019 and September 30, 2019 there were (583) calls for service. There were (4) Assaults, (3) Burglaries, (2) Robberies, (53) Larcenies; including 36 Entering Autos, 4 Stolen Vehicles and 13 Thefts. The Department recovered (8) stolen vehicles. The Department made 36 arrests. Average Response time was 2 min 37 secs.

The Department issued 586 citations to include parking, traffic and general copies.

The E911 Center processed 3,000 calls.

The Detective Division reviewed (733) cases, assigned (43) cases for investigation, and closed (64) cases. (2) Cases were closed with arrest warrants and (1) by CID arrest. The Detective Division obtained (8) warrants, responded to (9) crime scenes for investigation and executed (1) search warrant(s).

Code Enforcement: Code Enforcement handled (131) new calls for service. During these calls, the unit documented (7) animal incidents, (15) parking in grass, (19) tall grass & weeds, (14) permit issues, (32) outside storage, (17) littering or pollution problems, (0) Commercial Container Violation(s) and (0) property maintenance- exterior. The unit closed (158) cases and issued (13) citations.
