During the month of October, the Department conducted the following: 7 new construction site visits, 2 certificate of completion inspection / business licenses, 4 plan reviews, 33 annual inspections/alcohol license renewals, 1 mobile food vendor inspections, and 85 blood pressure checks at the Senior Center. The Fire Marshal and Assistant Fire Marshal also attended a post construction meeting for the Academy Theater. In addition, the Assistant Fire Marshal, along with our shifts, conducted 12 fire prevention classes at the Hapeville Elementary School with a total of 268 students participating. Other Fire Prevention classes were also taught at St John The Evangelist Catholic School for 160 students and 62 students at the Discovery Montessori School. Also, the following in house and off-site trainings were completed by our personnel: Trauma, Fire Alarms Systems, New Driver Training, EMS Culture & Diversity, Risk Management, EMS Health and Wellness, Area Familiarization, and Fire Department Communications. Our training chief taught a Stop the Bleed class to 17 members of the Hapeville Citizens of Patrol. Three members of the Administration participated in this year's Operation Save A Life hosted at the Home Depot Headquarters. As a result of our visit, the department received a total of 54 smoke alarms and 9 carbon monoxide alarms. Two members of the department provided EMS support during this year's Localmotion festival at the Jess Lucas Park. We are currently collecting donations of gently used clothing, hygiene items, and other much needed personal items as part of this year's Mayors' Motorcade which will be taken to the Georgia Regional Hospital. Items will be collected between November 1st - December 11th. Donation bins are located at City Hall, Fire Stations 1 & 2 and the Hoyt Smith Recreation Center.

Between October 1, 2019 and October 31, 2019 there were (541) calls for service. There were (2) Assaults, (1) Burglary, (0) Robberies, (80) Larcenies; including 54 Entering Autos, 6 Stolen Vehicles and 18 Thefts. The Department recovered (6) Stolen Vehicles and (1) Stolen Property item. The Department made 45 arrests. Average Response time was 2 min 41secs.

The Department issued 550 citations to include parking, traffic and general copies.

The E911 Center processed 3,318 calls.

The Detective Division reviewed (758) cases, assigned (38) cases for investigation, and closed (57) cases. (6) Cases were closed with arrest warrants and (1) by CID arrest. The Detective Division obtained (11) warrants, responded to (10) crime scenes for investigation and executed (1) search warrant(s).

Code Enforcement: Code Enforcement handled (218) new calls for service. During these calls, the unit documented (10) animal incidents, (13) parking in grass, (33) tall grass & weeds, (20) permit issues, (46) outside storage, (12) littering or pollution problems, (0) Commercial Container Violation(s) and (1) property maintenance- exterior. The unit closed (121) cases and issued (4) citations.
