During the month of February, the Department conducted the following: 6 new construction site visits, 6 plan reviews, 6 annual inspections, 8 pre-fire plans, 2 new business consultation, and 25 blood pressure checks at the Senior Center. The following in house and off-site training were completed by our personnel: Crash Victim Extrication, All units pump testing and COVID 19 response, policies and procedures. The Fire Marshal and the Assist Fire Marshal assisted a private inspector during a complaint investigation at a property recently purchased by the city. Our Fire Marshal also completed the following online courses: School Fire & Life Safety Inspections, Fire Prevention & Public Education, Assembly Occupancy Fire & Life Safety Inspection, Portable Extinguisher Types & Usage, Alcohol Free Workplace and NFPA 1500 -Respiratory Protection. All yearly inventories of SCBAs, cylinders and fire hoses have been completed. New Holomatro extrication equipment was received and a company representative has conducted an in-service training with all three shifts. The additional radios that were ordered have arrived, and we are currently waiting on them to be programmed by Bearcom for us to be able to put them in service. Chief Bloodworth continues to adjust our Department policies and procedures as new information is provided to us by the Georgia Department of Public Health (DPH) and the Atlanta Fulton Emergency Management Agency (AFCEMA), to ensure the safety of our entire staff and to continue providing proper response to every call received. We have also purchased all the safety equipment necessary to keep our crews protected in the event they are called to respond to a possible COVID 19 patient situation.

Between March 1, 2020 and March 31, 2020 there were (526) calls for service. There were (2) Assaults, (5) Burglaries, (2) Robbery, (43) Larcenies, including 26 Entering Autos, 4 Stolen Vehicles and 13 Thefts. The Department recovered (15) Stolen Vehicles and (1) Stolen Property Item. The Department made 39 arrests. Average Response Time was 2 min 08secs.

The Department issued 649 citations to include parking, traffic and general copies.

The E911 Center processed 3,243 calls.

Special Operation Division:

The Criminal Investigations Division The Detective Division reviewed (711) cases, assigned (19) cases for investigation, and closed (17) cases. (3) Cases were closed with arrest warrants. The Detective Division Obtained (12) warrants and responded to (4) crime scenes for investigation.

The Traffic Unit responded to (22) accidents, assisted Uniform Patrol on (24) occasions, wrote (44) reports, made (7) arrests, executed (1) search warrant, and wrote (380) citations & (13) warnings.

Code Enforcement: Code Enforcement handled (185) new calls for service. Of these calls, the unit documented (1) animal incidents, (15) parking in grass, (4) tall grass & weeds, (11) permit issues, (67) outside storage, (16) littering or pollution problems, (1) Commercial Container Violation(s), (21) Yard Debris and (19) property maintenance- exterior.. The unit closed (137) cases and issued (7) citations.

Abatements: The current properties that are under abatements are as follow: 3 Woodrow lot (between Wheeler and N. Fulton Avenue). As of January 28, 2020, abatement proceeding have begun on 3393 LaVista Drive, 336 Moreland Way, 240 Maple Street, and 831 Custer Street.
