During the month of August, the Department conducted the following: 6 new construction site visits, 3 plan reviews, 2 business licenses, 2 alcohol licenses, 1 fire alarm plan review and 2 certificate of occupation / business license inspection. The following in house and off-site training were completed by personnel: Rope training, New EMS documentation reporting and the new FEMA Basic Incident Command System for Initial Response (NIMS 200). Our training Chief and Fire Marshal attended the virtual Metro Atlanta Chiefs virtual monthly meeting. The Fire Chief continues to update the policies and procedures as new information is provided to us by the Georgia Department of Public Health (DPH) and the Atlanta Fulton Emergency Management Agency (AFCEMA), to ensure the safety of our entire staff and to continue providing proper response to every call received. We continue receiving Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) from the Department of Health and private donors and have distributed a portion of it to all City Departments to ensure the safety of all City Employees. The Department continues providing support during various City functions and meetings by conducting temperature checks for all those attending. A member of the Fire Administration participated in the Advanced Disciplinary Issues: Toxic Employees. Our Medical Director, Dr. Augustine, received the Presidential Award from the International Association of Fire Chiefs (IAFC) for his expertise in leading the Coronavirus Task Force in developing the "Guide for Coronavirus Planning & Response" for Fire Departments worldwide.

Between August 1, 2020 and August 30, 2020 there were (507) calls for service. There were (7) Assaults, (5) Burglaries, (1) Robbery, (36) Larcenies, including 18 Entering Autos, 5 Stolen Vehicles and 13 Thefts. The Department recovered (8) Stolen Vehicles and (3) Stolen Property Items. The Department made 29 arrests. Average Response time was 1 min 41 secs.

The Department issued 470 citations to include parking, traffic and general copies.

The E911 Center processed 2,823 calls.

The Detective Division reviewed (623) cases, assigned (17) cases for investigation, and closed (9) cases. (1) Case was closed with arrest warrants. The Detective Division obtained (12) warrants and responded to (3) crime scenes for investigation.

Code Enforcement: Code Enforcement handled (79) new calls for service. Of these calls, the unit documented (3) animal incidents, (3) parking in grass, (9) tall grass & weeds, (8) permit issues, (15) outside storage, (2) littering or pollution problems, (0) Commercial Container Violation(s), (21) Yard Debris and (1) property maintenance- exterior. The unit closed (22) cases and issued (0) citations.

Abatements: The current properties that are under abatements are as follow: 3 Woodrow lot (between Wheeler and N. Fulton Avenue). As of January 28, 2020, abatement proceedings have begun on 240 Maple Street, and 831 Custer Street.
