During the month of April, the Department conducted the following: 5 business licenses/certificates of occupancy, 5 site plan reviews, 29 annual inspections, and 15 consultation/site visits. Our personnel completed over 1,000 hours of in house and off-site training to include the following: Hose Deployment, Lucas Device Utilization, Rapid Intervention Team (RIT) training, Report Writing, and High Hazard Pre-Incident Planning for Life Storage. All fire hoses on Engine 2 were tested. Several members of the Department continue to provide support to the Georgia Department of Health, by administering COVID-19 vaccinations to hundreds of citizens from all of Metro Atlanta and neighboring cities. A total of 160 hours of assistance over a period of 30 days was provided at the Georgia International Convention Center in College Park. The Fire Marshal and Assistant Fire Marshal completed the National Professional Qualifications (NPQ) Fire Inspector I at the Georgia Public Safety Training Center (GPSTC) in Forsyth, GA. Their certification is recognized at the national level. The Training Division Chief assisted the Spalding County Fire Department with their Lieutenant promotional test process. He also taught Pressurized Container Fire Control at the Georgia Fire Academy in Forsyth, GA.

Between April 1, 2021 and April 30, 2021 there were (506) calls for service. There was (1) Assault, (1) Burglary, (3) Robberies, (43) Larcenies, including 23 Entering Autos, 7 Stolen Vehicles and 13 Thefts. The Department recovered (13) Stolen Vehicles. The Department made 30 arrests. Average Response time was 02 min 22 secs.

The Department issued 525 citations to include parking, traffic and general copies.

The E-911 center processed 3,112 calls for service.

The Detective Division reviewed (525) cases, assigned (15) cases for investigation, and closed (27) cases. (3) Cases were closed with arrest warrants and (1) by CID arrest. The Detective Division obtained (7) warrants, responded to (4) crime scenes for investigation and executed (1) search warrant(s).

Code Enforcement: Code Enforcement handled (12) new calls for service. Of these calls, the unit documented (1) animal incidents, (2) parking in grass, (6) tall grass & weeds, (0) permit issues, (3) outside storage, (5) littering or pollution problems, (5) Yard Debris and (0) property maintenance- exterior. The unit closed (0) cases and issued (0) citations.
