During the month of July our Department conducted the following 1 Fire Alarm inspection, 50 pre-fire plans, 20 construction visits, 8 pan reviews, 7 site consultations, 6 business licenses inspections, 74 blood pressure check, 1 Fire Protection Inspection, and 5 certificates of occupancy. Our personnel completed in house and off-site trainings to include the following: Ventilation, Fire Instructor II, Forcible Entry, Firefighter II Practical, Daily Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA), Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS) Refresher, Physical Conditioning, Electrical Safety, Electrical and Alternative Fuel Vehicles, Daily Vehicle Inspections, Structure Familiarization (St John the Evangelist Catholic School), Rescue Tools Power Plant Daily Inspection, Power Rescue Tool Daily Inspection, Replace and Operate Hydraulic Rescue Tools, Utilization of Cribbing Blocks, Reciprocating Saw Operations, ChainSaw Operations, and Generator Daily Inspection. Children from the Hoyt Smith summer camp visited fire station 1 for a tour. A total of 20 children participated. Our EMS Chief of EMS and Training Division Chief taught a CPR / AED class for 12 employees from Porsche NA Headquarters.

Between July 1, 2021 and July 31, 2021, there were (549) calls for service. There were (2) Assaults, (6) Burglaries, (2) Robberies, (32) Larcenies, including 16 Entering Autos, 7 Stolen Vehicles and 9 Thefts. The Department recovered (11) Stolen Vehicles and (2) Stolen Property Items. The Department made 30 arrests. Average Response Time was 02 min 28 secs.

The Department issued 426 citations to include parking, traffic, and general copies.

The E-911 center processed 3,396 calls for service.

The Detective Division reviewed (655) cases, assigned (19) cases for investigation, and closed (20) cases. (3) Cases were closed with arrest warrants and (1) by CID arrest. The Detective Division Obtained (6) warrants, responded to (5) crime scenes for investigation and executed (1) search warrant(s).

Code Enforcement: Code Enforcement handled (107) new calls for service. Of these calls, the unit documented (2) animal incidents, (2) parking in grass, (6) tall grass & weeds, (7) permit issues, (11) outside storage, (2) littering or pollution problems, (7) Yard Debris and (1) property maintenance- exterior.. The unit closed (323) cases and issued (1) citations.

July 17th: Chapman Drugs 100th Year Anniversary - "Thank You"! Thank you to all who participated in Chapman Drugs 100th Year Anniversary Celebration. Special "thank you" to the

Hapeville Main Street Board and all the volunteers who helped make this event memorable for the Chapman family.

July 26th: Staff attended the TSPLOST 2021 Communications Kickoff meeting. Citizens throughout Fulton County will have the opportunity to vote in November 2021 on a five-year T-SPLOST referendum to fund transportation projects in municipalities throughout the county. The T-SPLOST referendum would extend the existing 0.75% (3/4 of a cent) sales tax approved by voters in November 2016.

All cities presented their lists of potential projects for T-SPLOST to Fulton County. Fulton County will create a final list in July 2021. If authorized, the vote will take place in November 2021. The City of Hapeville has compiled a list of potential projects that would be considered as transportation related and would meet the necessary criteria. With our current TSPLOST funds we have repaired sidewalks, resurfaced roads, installed new safety signage and we are currently under construction with new Silent Railroad Crossings. An updated street condition inventory is on the Community Services website for paving inquiries.

We invite citizens to give input on the proposed project list.

Ongoing Task: Coordinated in-house Planning & Zoning administrative tasks with City Planner.
