During the month of August our Department conducted the following 16 yearly inspections, 56 pre-fire plans, 20 new construction visits, 1 fire sprinkler system pressure test, 2 environmental studies, 8 pan reviews, 1 impact study for planning commission, 1 alcohol license inspection, 5 business licenses inspections, 71 blood pressure check, 2 food truck inspections and 2 planning commission reviews. Our personnel completed in house and off-site trainings to include the following: Forcible Door Entry Training, Technical Rescue, Physical Conditioning, Firefighter II: Fire Control, Fire Hose, Fire Stream, Skills, EMS Guidance Outline, New 5" Large Diameter Hose (LDH) with Storz Couplers and Spanner Wrenches Familiarization. Daily Vehicle Inspection, Daily SCBA Inspections, Med 2 State Inspection Readiness, Advanced Weekly Apparatus Checkoffs, Equipment Use and Hydrant Area Maintenance, Protecting Fire Scene Evidence Our Chief of EMS Operations started his new position at Fire Administration. He will be overseeing all day-to-day EMS Operations. He along with the Fire Chief and Training Division Chief attended the South Fulton County Chiefs' meeting held at the Palmetto Train Depot. The yearly air packs test has been completed. All air packs are in compliance with state requirements. We have hired three new members for our Department. All three are already working on their respective shifts. One of our Lieutenants completed the Initial Fire Investigations: Origin and Cause Determination for the Company Officers. This is a required training for future promotions. Our Assistant Fire Marshal along with the Training Division Chief investigated two structural fires this month. The Fire Marshal and Assistant Fire Marshal attended the Pressurized Hazmat Container class hosted by the Coweta Fire Department at their Headquarters building.

Between August 1, 2021 and August 31, 2021, there were (670) calls for service. There were (6) Assaults, (3) Burglaries, (2) Robberies, (33) Larcenies, including 20 Entering Autos, 1 Stolen Vehicles and 12 Thefts. The Department recovered (11) Stolen Vehicles and (1) Stolen Property Items. The Department made 30 arrests. Average Response Time was 02 min 41 secs.

The Department issued 402 citations to include parking, traffic, and general copies.

The E-911 center processed 3,209 calls for service.

The Detective Division reviewed (668) cases, assigned (41) cases for investigation, and closed (35) cases. (4) Cases were closed with arrest warrants. The Detective Division Obtained (22) warrants, responded to (4) crime scenes for investigation, (2) CID Arrests. The Detective Division executed (3) Operation Orders with the assistance of Fulton County Sheriff's Office which yielded (7) Attempted Warrant Service, (2) Drug Arrests, (3) Fugitive Arrests, (1) Recovered Stolen Vehicle.

Code Enforcement: Code Enforcement handled (151) new calls for service. Of these calls, the unit documented (2) animal incidents, (4) parking in grass, (8) tall grass & weeds, (3) permit issues, (6) outside storage, (0) littering or pollution problems, (1) Yard Debris and (1) property maintenance- exterior.. The unit closed (222) cases and issued (6) citations.

July 17th: Chapman Drugs 100th Year Anniversary - "Thank You"! Thank you to all who participated in Chapman Drugs 100th Year Anniversary Celebration. Special "thank you" to the Hapeville Main Street Board and all the volunteers who helped make this event memorable for the Chapman family.

July 26th: Staff attended the TSPLOST 2021 Communications Kickoff meeting. Citizens throughout Fulton County will have the opportunity to vote in November 2021 on a five-year T-SPLOST referendum to fund transportation projects in municipalities throughout the county. The T-SPLOST referendum would extend the existing 0.75% (3/4 of a cent) sales tax approved by voters in November 2016.

All cities presented their lists of potential projects for T-SPLOST to Fulton County. Fulton County will create a final list in July 2021. If authorized, the vote will take place in November 2021. The City of Hapeville has compiled a list of potential projects that would be considered as transportation related and would meet the necessary criteria. With our current TSPLOST funds we have repaired sidewalks, resurfaced roads, installed new safety signage and we are currently under construction with new Silent Railroad Crossings. An updated street condition inventory is on the Community Services website for paving inquiries.

We invite citizens to give input on the proposed project list.

Ongoing Task: Coordinated in-house Planning & Zoning administrative tasks with City Planner.
