Between December 1, 2022, and December 31, 2022, there were (534) calls for service. There were (0) Assaults, (4) Burglaries, (3) Robberies, (43) Larcenies, including 29 Entering Autos, 1 Stolen Vehicle, and 13 Thefts. The Department recovered (11) Stolen Vehicles and (2) Stolen Property Items. The Department made 43 arrests. The average Response Time was 03 min 26 secs.

The Department issued 410 citations, including parking, traffic, and general copies.

**We are unable to report the number of calls processed through the E-911 center as AT&T's software is currently down.

The Detective Division reviewed (676) cases, assigned (21) cases for investigation, and closed (26) cases. (1) Cases were closed with arrest warrants. The Detective Division Obtained (3) warrants, responded to (2) crime scenes for investigation and executed (1) search warrant(s).

Code Enforcement: Code Enforcement handled (141) new calls for service. Of these calls, the unit documented (9) animal incidents, (16) parking in grass, (2) tall grass & weeds, (11) permit

issues, (0) outside storage, (83) littering or pollution problems, (0) Yard Debris and (1) property maintenance- exterior. The unit closed (145) cases and issued (0) citations.

Tax Collection:

As of December 30, 2022, staff has collected \$5,351,390.73 or 93% total real property taxes billed. The 2022 Real and Personal Taxes were due by December 5, 2022, to avoid penalties and late fees. Courtesy phone calls were made to property owners with outstanding balances after the due date to collect outstanding balances prior to issuing FIFA's. Intent to FIFA letters are being generated and will be mailed to all outstanding property owners in early January 2023.

Tax Ordinance:

Staff reviewed the current tax ordinance and proposed updates. The suggested updates will bring the ordinance in alignment with current tax practices and procedures reflective of Financial Services serving as the custodians of property tax administration and execution. We met with the City Attorneys and City Manager to discuss the recommended changes.

Interactive Voice Response System (IVR)- Pay by Phone, 1-877-877-2194:

The IVR system is operational. Many citizens have begun to utilize the payment opportunity; approximately 10% of account holders used the system in December. Staff's goal is to increase the number of users to about 20% each month and advocate for use of the system during busy times of the month such as the 15th, which is the bill due date. The system offers English and Spanish options. Flyers are available in both Spanish and English versions. The flyers have shared with utility account holders that have come to Central Cashiering to pay their bills. IVR has been highlighted in the November and December newsletters. IVR- Pay by Phone is offered alongside other payment options such as online (web) payments, payments in-person, payments via US Postal Service (mail), and drop box located at City Hall.

Short-term Rentals (STR):

The STR application is available online at www.Hapeville.org. Residents can download the application and apply for a permit. Support documents, such as a submission checklist are available to ensure all support documents are submitted. Internal procedures have been established. The financial system has been updated to accommodate new STR applications. Last, staff mailed written notifications of the application process to seventy-three (73) identified STR owners.

Administration:

Our team holds monthly financial services staff meetings to ensure the continuity of all major projects and tasks.

We enlist monthly training to make sure staff has all the necessary tools and resources to perform their duties. December's training centered around the STR process.

Staff provided support services to other departments by providing tax information to the City Clerk in support of alcohol renewals. Also, staff provided 2022 business license information to the City Clerk for the annual Immigration Report.
