The Department had 30 fire inspections, 12 new construction site visits, 3 plan reviews, 13 pre-fire plans, and 90 blood pressures checked. Three smoke detectors were given out to residents within the community and 2 burn permits were issued. A fire extinguisher class was provided for approximately 125 employees at the Porsche construction site. A total of 54 hours of firefighters on patrol were completed. During the month of March, all three shifts conducted training in the following areas: Firefighter II Building Construction, Water Supply, Fire Hose & Fire Streams as part of the requirements to meet the National Standards for Firefighter 2. All three shifts attended the Airport Familiarization Class taught by the Atlanta Fire Department. Additional training was done in the utilization of ropes, knots and tools. Two department officers attended the yearly Arson Investigator's Seminar in McDonough, GA. An extrication exercise was conducted thanks to a vehicle donation made by Councilman Powell. All Department Paramedics completed training on the first part of a three part series for the new Atlanta Regional EMS Protocols. The Department's goal is to be operating under the new medical protocols starting June 1.

From March 1, 2014 to March 31, 2014 the Police Department answered (663) calls for service. There were (0) Rapes, (2) Assaults, (3) Burglaries, (1) Robbery, (17) Other Larcenies and (2) Stolen Vehicles. The agency made (80) arrests and recovered (12) stolen vehicles. The agency's average response time was 2 minutes 44 seconds. The organization wrote (403) tickets: (336) Traffic tickets, (56) General and (11) Parking.

The Detective Division reviewed (663) cases, assigned (24) cases for investigation, and closed (39) cases. Seven (7) cases were closed with arrest warrants and (2) CID arrests were made. The Detective Division investigated (16) crime scenes and executed (2) search warrants.

The Detective Division is currently operating a crime suppression detail. The detail is intended to prevent or arrest suspects of auto theft and entering autos.

Department personnel continue to receive daily roll-call and in-service training on topics such as the Department's standard operating procedures (SOP), Case Law, Legal Updates, International Accreditation and State Certification.

Code Enforcement handled (204) new calls for service, of which: (29) were animal incidents, (48) for outside storage violations, (14) for parking on the grass, (7) Permit Violations and (48) were other code compliance issues. The unit wrote (11) citations, closed (209) cases, and has (138) active cases.

3249 North Fulton – The owner was cited and he is in the process of getting the property in compliance with city code. As of 04-01-14, the property has been cleaned however the damage to the rear of the residence remains.

3409 Dogwood Drive – Fulton County sold the tax lien. The front of the property has been cut and cleared however the rear is in need of regular maintenance.

644 Coleman Street – The property did not sell and the owner was cited for a 04-22-14 court date. The property is in compliance at this time.

639 Cofield Drive - A caretaker of the property has been informed of a fallen tree and property damage. A certified letter with citations has been mailed to the address to begin the abatement process. The property is being maintained by a family member however the tree in the rear remains.

3118 Sylvan Road - citations sent certified mail and returned as not delivered. Code Enforcement has been unable to successfully issue citations to the owner. As of this date, the trash, grass and weeds are being maintained however there are still some building issues.

429 Lake Drive – Fulton County now shows HUD as the owner.

The Department has three streetscape projects that are currently in the engineering stage. They are as follows: **Dogwood Drive** from S. Central to N. The engineering is complete on the **N. Fulton Ave. Streetscape Project** and the **N. Central Avenue Streetscape Project** and construction should begin sometime in 2014.

They continued work on their historic plaque program and are considering beginning the program with installations on municipal owned historically significant properties in downtown. The Board is planning their annual budgeting/retreat to begin to prepare a proposed budget and work plan for Council approval during the formal budgeting process. Board members also served as volunteers at the South Arts Film Festival screenings, providing information on the program and the Christ Church venue and welcoming visitors to the City.
